City Hall April 4, 2022

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, April 4, 2022 at 5:59 pm by Mayor James Meyer.

Motion by Christi McKenzie to pay bills as presented totaling \$43,901.46 was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Motion by Christi McKenzie to approve agenda as written was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Jason Connell arrived at 6:01pm.

Christi McKenzie thanked Mayor Meyer for meeting with RCDC and scheduling meeting with other organizations to make plans for Tall Corn Festival activities.

Utility Superintendent Alan Zlatnik reported that McGuire Iron had submitted addendum to contract for additional \$13,000.00 to change color of water standpipe from red to white and to repaint bulldog. Following discussion motion by Todd Reeves that water standpipe be painted original red color and that bulldog be removed leaving only ROSSVILLE in white or black was seconded by Christi McKenzie and carried. Changes to remove bulldog would result in \$4,100.00 credit to previous quote.

Mayor reported that he had received inquiry about putting fluoride in City water. Clerk reported that this issue was discussed by previous councils and that due to the possible toxicity of excessive fluoride they had decided not to add. No action was taken.

Superintendent Zlatnik reported that conference in Wichita was good training and had given him information on the new lead and copper rules that may be implemented.

Police Chief Jason Connell had nothing to report.

Mayor Meyer reported on installation of new light poles at ballfield. Mayor noted that J Warren has assured him that engineers are indicating that 60' poles with LED lighting will be sufficient for the stadium. Mayor has agreed to proceed with installation of 60' poles with assurance that they will be replaced with 80' poles by J Warren, if not sufficient, upon City paying cost difference for taller poles. Installation is now being delayed as J Warren is waiting on light brackets.

Council discussed advertising signs on ballfield fence. Following discussion council requested that utility department check signs and make list of signs needing replaced.

Mayor Meyer reported that he had talked to principal at Rossville Grade School regarding "no parking" signs along Pottawatomie Street and will have utility department reduce number of signs. Mayor also indicated that principal requested that school zone lights be adjusted to start at 7:15 am. Council also discussed adding school zone to Pearl Street. No action was taken.

Clerk reported that KMIT would not quote employee health insurance due to risk rating being more that 10% higher than the pool. Council reviewed rates as quoted by Blue Cross and Blue Shield. Matter was tabled until next meeting.

Christi McKenzie reported on grant that Myron Leinwetter is working on for walking trail and safe streets.

Motion by Todd Reeves to adjourn was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:49 pm.
