The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, August 16, 2021 at 6:59 pm by Mayor Kenneth Wichman.

Council members present were Christi McKenzie, Dan Glotzbach, Toby McCullough, Trish Heim and James Meyer.

Also present were Alan Zlatnik, Harry Hammer III and Jason Connell.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to approve minutes of the August 2, 2021 meeting as corrected was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Motion by Toby McCullough to pay bills as presented totaling \$58,340.74 was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Motion by Christi McKenzie to approve agenda with addition of ordinances and demolition permit under new business and executive session request after old business was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Mayor reported that complaint had been received regarding lack of completed sidewalk along Griswold Street in Kross Subdivision #1. Clerk to check property information.

Utility Superintendent Alan Zlatnik reported that the sewer cleaning had been completed and that 150 ft. of line has been identified as needing replaced along the 100-200 block of Navarre Street. Following discussion motion by Toby McCullough to approve expense for utility department to proceed with replacement of sewer line was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Superintendent Zlatnik reported that the Hog Ball tournament went well and that the utility department would begin reconstruction of bull pen areas and talk to USD #321 about work to level Campbell field. Council also discussed removing, relocating or adding roof to deck area to make safe.

Superintendent Zlatnik noted that several meter reading antennas have been damaged by residents and inquired about charging residents for replacement of antennas. Following discussion council to consider sending out newsletter reminding residents to be careful of the meters when mowing or doing yard work.

Superintendent Zlatnik noted that WTC is installing fiber cable east of Orange Street in last section of town to be completed.

Superintendent Zlatnik reported that the crosswalk lights are working and are ready for school to start.

Police Chief Jason Connell reported on activity during Tall Corn Festival.

Chief Connell discussed code enforcement issues and actions taken.

Chief Connell reported that 2015 Tahoe police vehicle has major mechanical issues and will need to be repaired. Bid for repairs from Gray's would be \$3,500.00. Motion by James Meyer to proceed with repairs was seconded by Toby McCullough and carried.

Mayor noted that he had recommended a pay raise for hourly employees based on budget numbers of \$.50 per hour. Following discussion motion by James Meyer to approve pay increase for all hourly employees of \$.50 per hour with backpay from June 1, 2021 was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Clerk requested permission for Asst. Clerk Tracey Taylor to attend year 4 of the Clerk Institute & Master Academy. Motion by Dan Glotzbach to allow Taylor to attend was seconded by Christi McKenzie and carried.

Ordinance REGULATING PUBLIC OFFENSES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ROSSVILLE, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES," 37<sup>th</sup> EDITION, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE # 830 was presented. Motion by Christi McKenzie to approve ordinance was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried. Ordinance was assigned number 833.

Ordinance REGULATING TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ROSSVILLE, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES," 48<sup>th</sup> EDITION, WITH CERTAIN OMISSIONS, CHANGES AND ADDITIONS; PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS; PROVIDING CERTAIN PENALTIES AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 829 was presented. Motion by James Meyer to approve ordinance was seconded by Trish Heim and carried. Ordinance was assigned number 844.

Demolition permit application for barn at 422 W. Adrian was presented. Motion by Christi McKenzie to approve permit was seconded by Toby McCullough and carried.

Motion by Toby McCullough to go into executive session for 20 minutes to discuss personnel was seconded by James Meyer and carried. Executive session to be from 7:52 to 8:12pm. Mayor and council to attend.

Council reconvened open session at 8:10 pm.

Motion by Toby McCullough to adjourn was seconded by Trish Heim and carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:10pm.
