Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$51,384.84 was seconded by Toby McCullough and carried.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve agenda as written was seconded by James Meyer and carried.

Council had discussion regarding possible new business at previous location of Puffy's Steakhouse and reopening of Short Stop. No action was taken.

Utility Superintendent Alan Zlatnik reported that sewer samples taken from Griswold lift station and lines going to and from the manor had been sent to lab and results were received late today. Zlatnik will review results and give report at the next meeting.

Superintendent Zlatnik reported that he was still getting bids for painting of water tower and also noted that leak that occurred last week has been repaired but required that the water in town be shut off for about an hour and twenty minutes. Zlatnik thanked his crew for their hard work in getting leak repaired and service restored quickly.

Clerk noted that Councilmember McKenzie had inquired about park playground signs. Zlatnik noted that he would check on signs.

Superintendent Zlatnik noted that councilmember Heim had consulted with him and they had viewed ongoing issues with dumpster at 601-603 Griswold Street. City to check with Shawnee County Refuse regarding ideas to correct issues.

Police Chief Jason Connell presented bid from WatchGuard for warranty on camera system at cost of \$3,395.00. Following discussion motion by Toby McCullough to approve payment of warranty was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Council had discussion regarding City wide garage sales and clean up event. Following discussion council agreed to set date for garage sales of May 7-8, 2021 however the City will not be organizing event with list of addresses or flyer. In addition, the City will not provide dumpsters for City wide clean up.

Council noted that Wamego Telecommunications WTC had 50% of residents sign up as part of their online campaign.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to adjourn was seconded by Toby McCullough and carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:40pm.
