

March 7, 2022

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, February 7, 2022 at 7:00 pm by Mayor James Meyer.

Council members present were Dan Glotzbach, Trish Heim, Todd Reeves and Toby McCullough. Christi McKenzie was absent.

Also present was Alan Zlatnik and Jason Connell.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve minutes of the February 22, 2022 meeting as corrected was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Motion by Toby McCullough to pay bills as presented totaling \$32,191.88 was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to approve agenda as written was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Mayor reported that the City would need insurance carrier in place by April 1, 2022 and that Peoples Insurance was to provide quote from EMC. Other agencies contacted to provide quote had not been able find underwriter that provides insurance to public entities. Mayor noted that, after new insurance is in place, City Attorney Stanley Oyler would proceed with drafting of lease agreement for walking trail property.

Utility Superintendent Alan Zlatnik reported that the boards were up for signage along 54<sup>th</sup> street ditch.

Superintendent Zlatnik reported that cost of materials, not including boring of lines, to put in new sprinklers at the pool would be approximately \$567.73.

Superintendent Zlatnik reported that Kent Fence was to repair Campbell ball park fence that was damaged by tree limb this week and that J. Warren was hoping to have new light poles the week of the 21<sup>st</sup>.

Police Chief Jason Connell reported that he had no new information on inspection of trailer at 525 W. Pottawatomie.

Council inquired about hours being worked by part time police officer Jacob Akin. Chief Connell reported that he had recently changed shifts and had to adjust hours for a while but should be back to regular hours.

Toby McCullough inquired about sidewalks across railroad tracks on Anderson Street crossing. Dan Glotzbach noted that he was waiting for spring to address this matter.

Mayor noted that the he needs to appoint a new member of the Shawnee County Fire District #3 board from members of the City Council. Board meetings are held the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of each month at 7:30pm. Mayor asked council members to let him know if they would like to volunteer.

Clerk inquired about setting dates for City wide garage sales. Following discussion council decided to set dates of garage sales for May 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> and noted that the City would not be publishing a list but would advertise the event on Facebook and the City website.

Council had discussion about moving City Council meeting times from 7pm to 6pm. Clerk to prepare ordinance for next meeting.

Motion by Todd Reeves to adjourn was seconded by Toby McCullough and carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:29pm.
