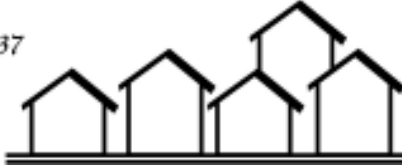

April 6, 2026

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, April 6, 2026 at 6:00 pm by Mayor James Meyer.

Council members present were Trish Heim, Rick Towers, Vern Sumner and Dan Glotzbach. Todd Reeves was absent.

Also present were Chance Stum, Thomas Sipp, Myron Leinwetter, Seth Brackman, Gregory Fankhauser and Charlotte French.

Motion by Rick Towers to approve the minutes of the March 16, 2026 meeting as presented was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$64,299.04 was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to approve the agenda with addition of Charlotte French and Myron Leinwetter was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Charlotte French was present to report that they are still planning on holding the farmers market in the City Park on Thursdays from 4 to 6pm if council still ok with plans. Council agreed to allow use of City Park for farmers market event.

Myron Leinwetter reported on Safe Routes to School project funding and application process. With a budget for the project of over \$2,000,000.00 the City share would be around \$400,000.00 if grant is approved. Leinwetter also noted that there might be some alternative options for funding through federal grants or piggybacking off of Shawnee County projects that could result in less local cost sharing. Engineering consultant Dan Holloway will attend the City Council meeting on the 20th to discuss this project.

Greg Fankhauser of World Insurance presented the EMC Insurance renewal quote for the City policy and presented the City with a dividend check for \$5,296.21. Renewal reflected a premium increase of 6%.

Mayor reported on possible date for ball stadium ribbon cutting and discussed putting new bulldawg emblems on dugouts.

Utility Superintendent Chance Stum presented proposal for inspection of water storage tank from Viking at a cost of \$1,000.00. Following review motion by Dan Glotzbach to approve proposal for inspection was seconded by Vernon Sumner and carried.

Council discussed area along railroad tracks needing debris removed so that weeds can be mowed and discussed need for repair to top rail of fencing at ball diamond with Utility Superintendent Chance Stum.

Police Chief Thomas Sipp reported that; crosswalk lights on the north side of Highway 24 that were reported as not working were fixed when the solar panel that had fallen off was put back by J. Warren after Chief Sipp contacted them; Shawnee County radio maintenance came out and updated all radios; he provided Myron Leinwetter with letter of support regarding KDOT grant application for removal of grain bins at Highway 24 and Main Street; Overland Park Police Department was giving away some hand held lidar and radar units and selected Rossville to receive one free of charge and that he and Brooklyn would be attending adult disposition training at KBI on Wednesday.

In addition, Chief Sipp reported on meeting with KDOT personnel regarding speed limit on Highway 24 through Rossville as well as possible school zones and changes to the crossing beacons.

Council discussed fine schedule changes, parking ordinance and inoperable vehicle on commercial property with Police Chief Thomas Sipp.

Council discussed repairs and possible changes to City Park playground area to include removal of trees and scheduling of a workday with volunteers helping to make repairs, remove mulch and paint. Council also discussed removal of horseshoe pits.

Council had discussion regarding mailing of notices to residents regarding wipes being flushed causing blockages and backups in the sewer system. Council requested that notice be added to the City Facebook page and mailing be sent out with the annual consumer confidence reports (CCR).

Council discussed advantages and disadvantages of obtaining parking area along the 100 block of W. Anderson St.

Clerk reported that we have received new quote from Blue Cross and Blue Shield and are waiting on new health insurance quote from Freedom Claims before reviewing.

Council discussed recent Facebook post regarding pit bull dog breeds not being allowed in the City. No action was taken.

Motion by Dan Goltzbach to adjourn was seconded by Vernon Sumner and carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:37pm.
