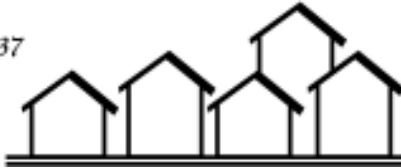

August 3, 2026

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, August 3, 2026 at 6:00 pm by Mayor James Meyer.

Council members present were Trish Heim, Rick Towers, Vern Sumner, Dan Glotzbach and Todd Reeves.

Also present were Thomas Sipp, Chance Stum, Darryl Olson, Donny Freel, Anwar Jamal, Tilak Tsap, Brett Waggoner and Myron Leinwetter.

Motion by Todd Reeves to approve the minutes of the July 20, 2026 meeting as written was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$40,665.35 was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to approve the agenda as presented was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Anwar Jamal and Tilak Tsap were present to request zoning change to property at 551 E. Highway 24 Trafficway from C1 to C2 to allow for used vehicle display and sales. Council inquired about number of vehicles and location and discussed zoning change reverting back to C1 if business changes owners or closes vehicle sales. Following discussion council tabled decision until they could consult with city attorney.

Darryl Olson was present to continue discussion regarding regulations for the operation of e-bikes and scooters on City streets. Olson has concerns about safety of those riding on streets and would like to have the City require helmets for anyone operating such vehicles on City Streets. Following discussion no action was taken.

Brett Waggoner, Grant Specialist with Governmental Assistance Services was present to report that the LMI survey was completed and the City of Rossville meets CDBG requirements with 55.31% of the population being low to moderate income. Council had discussion of possible projects that would qualify for grant applications and requirement for matching funds. Council to look at application for grant to complete walking trail project and renovate/upgrade park playground area.

Clerk noted that there was an article written by Kansas Rural Water Association in the monthly mailing on the valve project that they assisted with in Rossville.

Utility Superintendent Chance Stum reported that the Hog Ball tournament went good with participants/sponsors removing trash from cans to City dumpsters and picking up and cleaning the stadium, ball field and City park during and after their event.

Superintendent Stum reported that they are getting ready for the Tall Corn Festival celebration and that the rain has delayed the work of the sewer splitter box and line replacement. Utility personnel have sprayed City Park and will be spraying one more time for mosquitoes.

Police Chief Thomas Sipp reported that; they are ready for Tall Corn Festival; he spoke to the resident of 529 Spruce and has granted an extension of time to complete clean up of property; the resident of 514 Pine got trash and branches moved to truck bed; he contacted new owner at 509 Green street regarding clean up and contacted Jeff Overmyer about building permit requirements; that several fingerprints and VIN inspections have been completed in the last two weeks; that the department has been accepted into the 287g program and the he and Doug Schreiner have been submitted to the 40-hour online training; he had made contact with as many kids as possible that are riding e-bikes and scooters and let them know to make sure they are not riding on the highway or on the sidewalks and advised the ones riding the electric dirt bikes that they should be wearing helmets; and that property across street from police station was finally mowed but still some saplings growing in the area.

Matter of ordinance presented for review was tabled until final approval can be obtained from City Attorney.

Todd Reeves reported that Shawnee County approved the engine braking signs at City limits and that he would move forward with installing.

Motion by Trish Heim to go into executive session for 10 minutes to discuss personnel was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried. Executive session to be from 7:30 to 7:40 pm. Mayor, Council and City Clerk to attend.

Council reconvened in open session at 7:42pm.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to adjourn was seconded by Trish Heim and carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:42pm.
