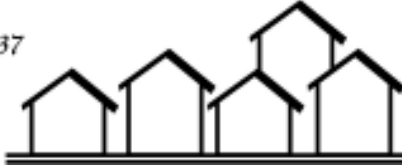

August 4, 2025

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, August 4, 2025 at 6:00 pm by Council President Trish Heim.

Council members present were Trish Heim, Todd Reeves, Dan Glotzbach, Rick Towers and Vern Sumner.

Also present were Thomas Sipp, Myron Leinwetter, Lacey Deiter, Alan Zlatnik and Charlotte French.

Motion by Todd Reeves to approve the minutes of the July 21, 2025 meeting as corrected was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$78,865.61 was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Motion by Rick Towers to adopt agenda with the addition of Lacey Deiter and Myron Leinwetter was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Charlotte French reported that the Rossville United Methodist Church had volunteers wanting to hold a farmers market on Thursdays from 4 to 7 pm and would like permission from the City to use the City parking lot at 429 Pearl Street to hold event. Following discussion motion by Todd Reeves to allow use of parking lot for farmers market as long as the Rossville Senior Citizens do not have a conflict with dates was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Lacey Deiter presented flyer for the Tall Corn Festival event and reported that committee plans to focus on family activities.

Myron Leinwetter presented flyer to be handed out regarding support of the Joe Campbell Memorial Stadium restoration project.

Myron Leinwetter reported on plans for phase two of the walking trail and discussed the need to make a decision regarding the closing of a portion of Parkway Street so that they can begin plans for phase three of the trail. Clerk noted that vacating of street would require legal documents to be prepared by City Attorney.

Clerk reported that on the resolution passed by Shawnee County Commissioners allowing consumption of alcohol on swimming pool parking lot property during tall corn festival.

Utility Superintendent Alan Zlatnik reported that he would be using accumulated vacation until final retirement date. Zlatnik also reported that Randy Anderson had given his two weeks notice and would also not be working after August 11.

Superintendent Zlatnik reported that all went well during ball tournament and that street repairs should begin the last week of August.

Superintendent Zlatnik requested permission to keep cell phone and phone number upon retirement. Following discussion motion by Vern Sumner to allow Zlatnik to keep phone and number was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Council had discussion with Superintendent Zlatnik regarding canceling of playground mulch and sewer cleaning by Rooter-Man as well as job applications and description.

Police Chief Thomas Sipp reported that he had contacted owner of short stop property and they were to be out tomorrow to take care of issues.

Chief Sipp reported that he had; addressed weeds at 516 Spruce; talked to resident at 589 Griswold regarding fence around pool; talked to resident at 434 Orange regarding weeds; attended tall corn festival meeting and will be closing streets as needed for car show and providing traffic control; discussed moving of beer garden in park; attended SRLEEA (Small & Rural Law Enforcement Executives Association) meeting and issued notice to resident at 324 Main regarding weeds and trash.

Council inquired about appointment of Harry Hammer III as police captain. Following discussion motion by Todd Reeves to approve appointment of Harry Hammer III as Rossville Police Captain was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Chief Sipp noted that the railroad put new ties along the walkway at Main Street crossing this morning.

Clerk presented application from the American Legion Post #31 for special event beer garden license at 702 Main Street from August 8 to August 11, 2025. Payment of \$25.00 for state stamp has been received and all other charges have been waived by the city. Motion by Todd Reeves to approve license was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Messge from Mayor that the City Attorney will continue to provide legal services in the suit against Jeffrey Solar, LLC as they proceed with appeal was presented. Original plaintiff will continue to cover fees.

Council had discussion regarding closing of the 400 block of Main Street for car show on Friday, August 8, 2025 and parade on Saturday, August 9, 2025. Following discussion council agreed to proceed as planned for tall corn festival activities with streets being closed as needed for events.

Clerk reported that retirement reception for Alan Zlatnik and Randy Anderson is being planned for August 27, 2025 from 12-3pm.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to adjourn was seconded by Rick Towers and carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:54pm.
