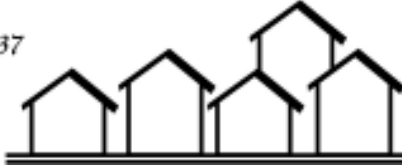

January 5, 2026

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, January 5, 2026 at 5:59 pm by Mayor James Meyer.

Council members present were Trish Heim, Dan Glotzbach, Rick Towers and Vern Sumner. Todd Reeves was absent.

Also present were Chance Stum, Thomas Sipp and Myron Leinwetter.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to approve the minutes of the December 15, 2025 meeting as corrected was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve the minutes of the December 19, 2025 special meeting as corrected was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$39,327.60 was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to adopt agenda with the addition of Myron Leinwetter was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Myron Leinwetter reported that work on the easement for the walking trail has been through emails from Casey's General Store and are progressing with Casey's requesting copy of survey and plans when available. Leinwetter inquired about need for any legal consultation at this time. Council advised that legal document for easement would be prepared by City Attorney when survey and plans are completed. Myron Leinwetter also reported that the phase 2 of the walking trail project has been completed up to the school drive and the remaining construction will be paused until better weather and that Wildlife and Parks will be planting native grasses/wildflowers along areas of the trail. Council had discussion with Myron Leinwetter about street crossing signals where trail will cross Parkway Street and how to avoid damage to trees in City Park area. Following discussion Myron Leinwetter noted that final plans for phase 3 of the walking trail would be presented to the City Council for approval when completed.

Application from Rossville Liquor Store for retail liquor license was presented. Clerk noted that fees have been paid. Motion by Dan Glotzbach to approve license was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Mayor reported that he had not had any further communication with representative of the company looking at establishing solar farms in Jackson County.

Utility Superintendent Chance Stum presented list of items completed by utility department to include work on; blading alleys; cleaning lift stations; building fuel filter system; trimming trees along alleys and changing all fluids in Ranger and generator.

Utility Superintendent Chance Stum requested permission to rent large trash dumpster to use in cleaning out and demolition of office and bathroom in old shop building. Following discussion, motion by Vernon Sumner to allow utility department to rent dumpster was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Utility Superintendent Chance Stum presented list of tool items needed for shop and trucks. Following discussion, regarding the need for additional tools and discussion of having an inventory completed motion made by Vernon Sumner to allow the utility department to purchase tools at a cost not to exceed \$5,000.00 was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Police Chief Thomas Sipp reported that; notice to abate issue at 503 Orange has been resolved; new computers have been installed at the police department and plan is being made to back everything up; information technology audit is scheduled with KHP on Friday; plans are to use remaining 2025 budget to pay off the 2024 Tahoe early; residents of Rossville are still parking vehicles in grass and keeping disabled or not legally registered vehicles on property and that they plan to purchase 1 additional AED. Following discussion, regarding 10-day notices to abate or contact with residents regarding unregistered vehicles or parking in grass, council advised Chief Sipp to proceed with issuing 10-day abatement notices. Council also discussed possible code violations on commercial property. Chief Sipp to check for violations.

Motion by Trish Heim to adjourn was seconded by Vernon Sumner and carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:03pm.
