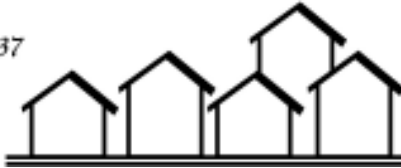

June 1, 2026

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, June 1, 2026 at 5:59 pm by Mayor James Meyer.

Council members present were Trish Heim, Rick Towers, Vern Sumner, and Todd Reeves. Dan Glotzbach was absent.

Also present were Thomas Sipp, Seth Brackmam, Lacey Deiter, and Kristi Harrell.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve the minutes of the May 18, 2026 meeting as presented was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Motion by Todd Reeves to pay bills as presented totaling \$36,227.72 was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve the agenda with addition of Lacey Deiter and Kristi Harrell was seconded by Vern Sumner and carried.

Lacey Deiter and Kristi Harrell from the Rossville Community Development Committee (RCDC) were present to discuss the annual Tall Corn Festival. Lacey and Kristi reported that the agenda for the Tall Corn Festival is nearly complete and that flyers should be distributed by the end of the month. Lacey and Kristi stated that there will be a community meeting regarding the Tall Corn Festival on June 22, 2026 at 6:00 pm at the City Park. Lacey and Kristi informed council of the schedule of events for the 2026 Tall Corn Festival. Lacey, Kristi, and council discussed any assistance RCDC might need from the city throughout the event.

Mayor presented request from Freda Lohse with the Rossville American Legion Post No. 31 regarding a buggy ride on June 6, 2026. Freda requested that out-of-town buggy riders be allowed to drive in Rossville city limits without an ATV/UTV permit for the duration of the buggy ride so long as they have wristbands that identify them as a legion buggy rider. Motion by Trish Heim to allow buggy ride participants with legion wristbands to ride within the city limits of Rossville without an ATV/UTV permit on Saturday, June 6, 2026 was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Motion by Trish Heim to go into executive session for 20 minutes to discuss personnel was seconded by Rick Towers and carried. Executive session to be from 6:23 pm to 6:43 pm with Mayor, council, and City Attorney attending.

Council reconvened in open session at 6:43 pm.

Assistant City Clerk presented letter from Kansas Infrastructure Hub informing the city that the application to receive Grant Assistance Program funds for the purpose of having a contracted service provider develop an application to the Safe Streets and Roads for All grant program has been approved.

Assistant City Clerk presented flyer from the Rossville American Legion Post No. 31 for a Flag Retirement Ceremony to be held on June 14, 2026 at 5:00 pm on Rossville's Main Street.

Police Chief Thomas Sipp reported that; the grass along the south side of Ash street has been mowed by the owner, he had spoken with the contractor at 150 Main and confirmed that the yard will be cleaned up by the end of the week, he had worked an accident involving an SUV that jumped the curb in front of City Hall and struck the purple bench, RPD received a hand-held Lidar and a hand-held radar unit from the Overland Park Police Department, he attended a Lidar training on May 27, 2026, he checked with KDOT about installing signs prohibiting the using exhaust brakes in city limits along Highway 24, Captain Hammer did a drive through the town after Sunday night's storm and assisted Shawnee County with a downed telephone pole, and three of RPD's office phones were not working on Sunday but that the issue was easily resolved.

Chief Sipp and council discussed weeds and drainage ditch located behind properties along southeast Perry Street.

Mayor and council discussed continued scheduled maintenance to the sewer lines along north Navarre Street.

Motion by Todd Reeves to approve employee salary changes as presented was seconded by Trish Heim and carried. List to be attached to minutes.

Discussion on the 2027 budget was tabled to the next meeting.

Assistant City Clerk presented application from the 12U Rossville Dawgs baseball team requesting to use the baseball field on June 23, 2026 for tournament. The 12U Rossville Dawgs also requested that the fees be waived as a majority of the athletes are Rossville residents. Motion by Todd Reeves to allow the 12U Rossville Dawgs to use the baseball field on June 23, 2026 and waive fees was seconded by Vern Sumner and carried.

Motion by Todd Reeves to adjourn was seconded by Trish Heim and carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:19 pm.
