March 21, 2022

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, February 21, 2022 at 7:00 pm by Mayor James Meyer.

Council members present were Dan Glotzbach, Trish Heim, Christi McKenzie, Todd Reeves and Toby McCullough.

Also present was Alan Zlatnik, Greg Frankhauser and Jason Connell.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve minutes of the March 7, 2022 meeting as written was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$39,169.65 was seconded by Toby McCullough and carried.

Motion by Christi McKenzie to approve agenda moving EMC insurance quote next on the agenda was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Greg Frankhauser with Peoples Insurance was present to review quote from EMC for City insurance coverage. Following review and discussion motion by Todd Reeves to proceed with insurance coverage for property and casualty but not workers compensation with EMC was seconded by Toby McCullough and carried.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve Resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign agreement with Kansas Municipal Insurance Trust (KMIT) for workers compensation coverage and approving the By-Laws and Inter-Local Cooperation Agreement was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Motion by Todd Reeves to acknowledge receipt of notice pursuant to K.S.A. 12-2626 that KMIT is a group-funded pool and not an insurance company was seconded by Christi McKenzie and carried.

Dan Glotzbach reported that he had sent email to railroad regarding sidewalks at Anderson Street crossing. Christi McKenzie reported that Myron Leinwetter was looking at KDOT grant for safe routes to school funding for walking paths that may include sidewalks at Anderson Street Crossing as well as along Highway 24. No action was taken.

Utility Superintendent Alan Zlatnik reported on progress of repairs and improvements to Campbell Field.

Superintendent Alan Zlatnik reported that inflow gate box at sewer lagoons needs to be replaced. Estimated cost for repairs would be \$10,000.00 To \$15,000.00. Zlatnik proposed using general fund monies allocated for streets to fund repairs. Following discussion Zlatnik noted that he would check on firm price and scheduling for repairs.

Superintendent Alan Zlatnik requested permission for the utility employees to attend Kansas 811 meeting at 6pm on Wednesday, March 23, 2022. Council approved.

Superintendent Zlatnik and Clerk requested permission for Assistant City Clerk Tracey Taylor to join personnel in attending Water Conference in Wichita on March 29, 30 and 31. Motion by Christi McKenzie to allow Taylor to attend conference, along with Zlatnik and Kirk, was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Toby McCullough reported that he had received complaint about items being stored on city gravel lot. Superintendent Zlatnik to address any problems with area.

Council inquired about elevated deck at Campbell Field. Mayor reported that volunteers were going to organize to have structure moved to outfield viewing location.

Superintendent Alan Zlatnik reported on water line break at Campbell Field.

Council discussed possible solutions to prevent graffiti on playground equipment such as painting area black.

Police Chief Jason Connell reported that he had met with WTC representative and are looking at security cameras at several locations. Cost for cameras would be \$5.00 a month per camera after set up.

Chief Connell reported that his department would be upping the code enforcement with the warmer weather.

Council discussed removing all or some of the "No Parking" signs in front of the Rossville Grade School at E. Pottawatomie Street. Mayor to contact school principal about concerns.

Ordinance AMENDING SECTION 1-205 OF THE CITY CODE OF ROSSVILLE REGARDING MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL was presented. Such Ordinance changes the start times for council meetings from 7:00pm to 6:00pm. Motion by Trish Heim to approve Ordinance was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried. Ordinance was assigned number 836.

Mayor Meyer reported that he had talked to Shawnee County Commissioner Bill Riphahn regarding repairs to the drainage ditch and they are still needing someone to claim ownership of the property so that they can proceed with application for funding to make repairs. Mayor also noted that he contacted attorney for drainage board and was waiting on further reply from board members.

Council inquired about grants for park bathroom project. Clerk not aware of any at this time but will check on mitigation grant.

Christi McKenzie reported on her residency status.

Motion by Toby McCullough to adjourn was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:09 pm.
