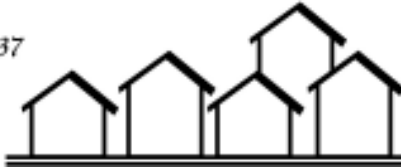

May 4, 2026

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, May 4, 2026 at 5:59 pm by Mayor James Meyer.

Council members present were Trish Heim, Rick Towers, Vern Sumner, Dan Glotzbach and Todd Reeves.

Also present were Chance Stum, Myron Leinwetter and Douglas Schreiner.

Motion by Rick Towers to approve the minutes of the April 20, 2026 meeting as presented was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$39,154.25 was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Motion by Todd Reeves to approve the agenda with addition of Myron Leinwetter was seconded by Vern Sumner and carried.

Myron Leinwetter was present to report that KDOT has approved contract with Jason Hoskinson of BG Consultants to work on the TEAP study and recommended that the City contract with Brett Waggoner of Governmental Assistance Services to prepare grant application for federal funding while they continue with application for State funding to complete the Safe Streets project in Rossville. In addition, Leinwetter reported that Governmental Assistance Services could assist the City with completion of survey to see if Rossville would qualify for Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) to assist with other projects. Following discussion motion by Todd Reeves to approve contract with Governmental Assistance Services for grant writing service at a cost of \$12,500.00 was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Council also discussed construction of retaining wall along walking trail next to the swimming pool, volunteers needed for 5K race, funding for removal of grain bins, ball stadium dedication ceremony and bike to school event scheduled for Wednesday with Myron Leinwetter.

Mayor asked Utility Superintendent Chance Stum to check on prices for new yellow cap on ball park fence.

Mayor reported that resident had inquired about applying to the railroad to make the City crossings "silent crossings" and the office staff had checked on the application process and found a number of regulations and potential costs. Mayor to follow up with resident.

Council noted that the Rossville Community Development Committee were moving the Tall Corn street dance back to Main Street.

Utility Superintendent Chance Stum reported that he had talked to Schulte Supply and Kansas Rural Water Association (KRWA) regarding line locator and no calibration is needed. Following discussion motion by Todd Reeves to purchase line locator from Schulte Supply at a cost of \$5,294.34 was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Superintendent Stum reported that, with help from KRWA, they have started locating, hydro-vacating and exercising water valves. KRWA will charge \$35.00 per hour for use of machine. In addition, KRWA will look at sewer line along Navarre Street and assist with information on contractor for replacement of sewer splitter box and rock at lagoons. Superintendent Stum reported he is also working with Hawkins Chemical to find a better additive for the control of manganese in the City water system.

Mayor reported that he had contacted relator regarding repair work on E. Perry Street and contractor is to repair.

Assistant Police Chief Douglas Schreiner provided Chief Sipp's list of items completed to include; repairs to license plate readers; attending law enforcement memorial on May 1st; new sign at police station with assistance from utility department who also assisted Captain Hammer with project; assisting preschool classes cross Highway 24; contacting property owners regarding low hanging trees blocking bus drivers view of traffic; attending Kansas Chiefs of Police conference; Chief and Assistant Chief completing 10 year capital plan, budget input and staffing suggestions and issuing 10-day abatement notices.

Assistance Chief Douglas Schreiner presented statistics and 10-year capital plan and budget/staffing suggestions.

Council discussed work needed at park play area. To look at possible community volunteer day in the fall.

Council discussed employee salary review. Clerk to prepare summary for next meeting.

Application for sale of fireworks from Garrett's Worldwide Enterprises was presented. Following review motion by Todd Reeves to approve permit was seconded by Vernon Sumner and carried.

Application for sale of fireworks from Christopher Connell for Operation Fireworks; Fire for Effect was presented. Motion by Todd Reeves to approve permit with stipulation that City is provided with sales tax certificate was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to adjourn was seconded by Trish Heim and carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:28pm
