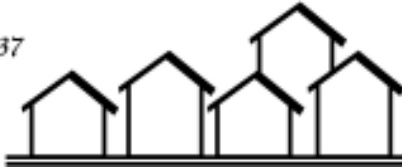

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, November 17, 2025 at 6:00 pm by Mayor James Meyer.

Council members present were Trish Heim, Todd Reeves, Dan Glotzbach, Rick Towers and Vern Sumner.

Also present were Chance Stum, Thomas Sipp, Dan Holloway, Bill Ebert, Alexis Ebert, Mike Newsham and Janet Leffel.

Motion by Todd Reeves to approve the minutes of the November 3, 2025 meeting as presented was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$63,565.18 was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve the agenda as presented was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Dan Holloway of CFS Engineers presented information on plans for phase three of the walking trail and noted that to complete the trail according to grant specifications, they were looking at closing a portion of Parkway Street. Residents Bill Ebert, Alexis Ebert, Mike Newsham and Janet Leffel inquired about other options to allow trail to be constructed without closing street. Council, residents and Holloway discussed project and concerns identified by residents. In addition, inquiry was made about plans for routing trail through City Park without damage to trees in area. Following discussion no action was taken.

Mayor James Meyer reported that option to route trail across Casey's property as alternative to closing street had been discarded previously when Casey's corporate office had not been receptive to the plan. Mayor noted that he had made several attempts to contact Casey's and today he had response from Casey's representative and they have agreed to take a second look at the request by the City to obtain an easement for this purpose.

Council expressed appreciation to Myron Leinwetter for the incredible amount of work that he has done on the trail projects and Safe Routes to School project and noted that they are glad that he is part of this community and appreciate his commitment to Rossville.

Bill Ebert, Alexis Ebert, Mike Newsham and Janet Leffel left at 6:46 pm.

Clerk presented cereal malt beverage license application from Casey's General Store for sale in original and unopened containers for 2026 and noted that the state has changed the procedures for applying for licenses. Clerk noted that Casey's General Store has provided background check and paid fees. Motion by Dan Glotzbach to approved 2026 CMB license for Casey's was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Utility Superintendent Chance Stum reported that the Utility Department had; cleaned and winterized ball field bathrooms; worked on electrical outlets and trim at police station; finished work on police car shed; cleaned welcome to Rossville sign; cleaned out shop gutters; cleaned lift station and mulched leaves at park.

Police Chief Thomas Sipp reported that; he made contact with previous owner and new owner of 150 Main Street regarding trash removal and that arrangements have been made to take care of the issue; he monitored the polling station on election day; he, Asst. Chief Schreiner, Captain Hammer and Officer Akin attended firearms range for qualification and night shoot and then he worked football game; tree at 525 Orange Street has been removed; he and Brooklyn attended Kansas Criminal Justice Information System training; he will be making contact with Dakota from Bit-by-Bit Solutions regrading background check before using as IT guy and that he contacted owner of 616 Green regarding branches cut down that were blocking street light.

Chief Sipp presented October incident report.

Council inquired about tree at 443 Main needing trimmed. Chief Sipp to follow up with notification.

Clerk presented finance report.

Mayor reported that contractor for construction project at the Rossville High School has requested permission to run temporary power from the City ball field. Mayor noted that clerk would estimate average bill and would monitor usage and contractor would pay the City \$500.00 to start and if usage exceeds that amount would reimburse the City further.

Council reviewed plans for changes to parking as part of school construction.

Motion by Todd Reeves to adjourn was seconded by Vernon Sumner and carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:10 pm.
