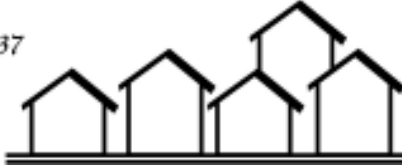

November 3, 2025

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, November 3, 2025 at 5:59pm by Mayor James Meyer.

Council members present were Trish Heim, Todd Reeves, Dan Glotzbach, Rick Towers and Vern Sumner.

Also present were Chance Stum, Thomas Sipp, Trace McDiffett and Myron Leinwetter.

Motion by Todd Reeves to approve the minutes of the October 20, 2025 meeting as presented was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$94,408.50 was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to approve the agenda as presented was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Mayor reported that the ball stadium was looking great and they were waiting on material before applying the last coat of paint.

Draft of agreement between that City of Rossville and USD #321 whereby USD #321 would agree to pay for any repairs and other services required to complete repairs to sewer, water, cable TV, electric, gas and telephone in utility easement at location of Rossville High School building addition was presented. Following review council approved agreement.

Utility Superintendent Chance Stum presented list of completed items to include moving of asphalt millings to Toadstrangler Trail parking; painting ball field and concession stand doors; painting outside wall in park; clean and winterize park bathrooms; determine that auto chlorine reader cannot be fixed; completed repairs to second half of alley and fix pot holes in two other alleys.

Superintendent Stum presented quote for one week rental of platform lift to be used to remove tree at park and several other items throughout the City at a cost of \$1,749.00. Following discussion council approved rental of platform lift.

Superintendent Stum presented quote from Kan Equip for New Holland L328 Skid Steer with smooth, tooth and V-blade. Quote included numbers for trade-in of Case Farmall tractor, attachments and 1996 skid steer. Cost to purchase L328 skid steer after trade in would be \$15,994.00. Council inquired about budget balances for 2025. Following discussion motion by Todd Reeves to purchase New Holland Skid Steer and trade in Farmall tractor, attachments and 1996 skid steer at a cost of \$15,994.00 was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Police Chief Thomas Sipp reported; on traffic control for homecoming parade and working football game and walk through at American Legion; that trees at 616 Green Street have been cut down; that traffic on Highway 24 is back to normal; that he had advised the dentist office that the tree out in front needs to have 8 feet of clearance; that he has talked to City Attorney Stanley Oyler regarding issued with resident parking in front of methodist church; that he had attended Kansas Intelligence Association training in Salina; that there had been a good turnout for Halloween activities on Main Street; that he had contacted the new owner of 150 Main Street regarding trash and that he had contacted resident at 525 Orange about dead tree.

Chief Sipp presented proposal from Bit by Bit Solutions LLC to provide IT services at \$115.00 per hour. Following discussion motion by Trish Heim to enter into agreement with Bit by Bit Solutions LLC for IT services was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Council discussed tag reader that is located at police station and Axon camera system with Police Chief Sipp. No action was taken.

Council made plans to schedule City holiday celebration for December 3rd and requested that Gary Spring be approached to again provide food.

Council discussed options for federal employees if shut down effects ability to pay City utility bills. Council agreed to not interrupt services and waive late fees for anyone verifying that they are affected by the shutdown.

Council scheduled end of year meeting for Monday, December 29, 2025 at 6pm.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to adjourn was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:13pm.
