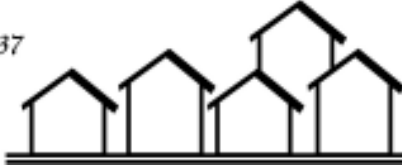

September 20, 2021

Due to the absence of the Mayor the Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, September 20, 2021 at 7:00 pm by Council President James Meyer.

Council members present were Toby McCullough and Trish Heim. Dan Glotzbach was absent.

Also present were Alan Zlatnik and Jason Connell.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve minutes of the September 7, 2021 meeting as corrected was seconded by Toby McCullough and carried.

Motion by Toby McCullough to pay bills as presented totaling \$53,091.37 was seconded by Trish Heim and carried.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve agenda as presented was seconded by Toby McCullough and carried.

James Meyer reported that residents at 615 Maple Court had install a handicapped ramp and noted that no permit was needed as ramp would be temporary.

Christi McKenzie arrived at 7:06pm.

Trish Heim reported that she had attended court session and defendant present at court had commented that Officer Hammer III was the nicest officer she had ever dealt with.

Utility Superintendent Alan Zlatnik reported that all went well on first of the three sewer main repairs.

Police Chief Jason Connell reported that new program for employee time cards has been working well.

Chief Connell noted that due to rising COVID concerns and increase cases in children he would recommend that the Halloween hot dog/chili feed be canceled again this year and reassessed for next year.

Trish Heim reported on code violation cases addressed at court and noted that one had addressed violations by using tarps to enclose carports and other was still working on moving vehicle.

Trish Heim inquired about letter being sent to new homeowner at 501 Griswold Street regarding maintenance of ditch.

Council inquired about any problems with the Rossville Grade School traffic behind the building. Chief Connell reported that no problems have been noted.

Council noted that Facebook post is indicating that some residents will have WTC service by the end of fall.

Council discussed progress by CBK in collecting outstanding debts and inquired about sale of building at 601 E Highway 24 Trafficway.

Ordinance **AMENDING CODE SECTIONS 3-114 AND 3-305 OF THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF ROSSVILLE, KANSAS REGULATING THE DATES AND TIMES OF RETAIL SALES OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR AND CEREAL MALT BEVERAGES IN THE CITY OF ROSSVILLE, KANSAS** was presented. Motion by Christi McKenzie to approve ordinance was seconded by Toby McCullough and carried. Ordinance was assigned #835.

Clerk reported that building permit application for construction of new entry for the Rossville Community Library had been approved by Jeffrey Overmyer and inquired about waiving of building permit and inspection fees. Following discussion motion by Toby McCullough to waive fees was seconded by Trish Heim and carried with Toby McCullough, Trish Heim and James Meyer voting aye and Christi McKenzie abstaining.

James Meyer reported that he had made repairs to ramp at the police station and noted other repairs needing to be done such as new siding, windows and roof. No action was taken.

Motion by Trish Heim to adjourn was seconded by Christi McKenzie and carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:40pm.
